## Feb 1 – Fannie Lou Hamer

Fannie Lou Hamer was born on Oct 6, 1917 in Mississippi. She became involved in the Civil Rights Movement when she first attempted to register to vote in 1962, which resulted in her being fired from her job on a plantation. In 1964 she co-founded the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party to end statewide disenfranchisement of Black voters. In her nationally televised testimony before the Democratic National Convention, Hamer shared her personal stories of mistreatment and terror at the hands of racists throughout MS. The testimony was interrupted by President Lyndon Johnson, in an effort to suppress the truth and stabilize the Democratic Party.
