Feb 4 – Ida B. Wells

<u>Ida B. Wells-Barnett</u> was born into slavery on July 16, 1862 and freed by the Emancipation Proclamation. She held a career as an educator and later a journalist chronicling the African American experience in the early 1900s. Her work on documenting the lynching practices in *The Red Record*, and horrors of the South attained a global audience despite being labeled a race agitator in the United States.
